Get on the Hotspot

Waiting List!

Mobile wireless internet devices hotspots - are available for checkout. To
get on the request list, fill out a request
slip at the circulation desk. When a
hotspot is available, we will call you!
You can use a hotspot with any wi-fi
ready device such as a tablet, smartphone or laptop computer.

You must be 18 years or older, a resident of Freeborn County with an Albert Lea Public Library card in good standing. Hotspots go out for 3 weeks and have

no grace period. Late fees are \$1/day with a max of \$10.
