#### V. CONSENT AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA

- C. Appointment of Marlys Steele to the Senior Center Board The appointment of Marlys Steele will fill the one opening on the Senior Center Board. Mayor Murray has reviewed Marlys's application and has approved her appointment.
- D. Resolution Accepting Feasibility Report and Calling a Public Hearing at 7:00 PM, February 24, 2005 for the 2025 Neighborhood Improvement Project (Job 2501) This item would accept a feasibility report and call a public improvement hearing for February 24, 2025 for the 2025 Neighborhood Improvement Project, City Job No. 2501.

The proposed project has two main components: bituminous mill & overlay in the Crossroads Boulevard area and a portion of Lake Chapeau Drive, and replacement of the bituminous surface on a portion of SE Marshall Street. The streets in the mill & overlay area include:

- Lake Chapeau Drive City Arena to the west end
- Crossroads Boulevard TH 65 to the south end
- Betha Larson Lane Crossroads Boulevard to the east end
- Ross Drive Crossroads Boulevard to Betha Larson Lane
- Kram Avenue Betha Larson Lane to the north end

Work in the mill & overlay area will involve milling the existing bituminous street surfacing for a 6-foot width along each concrete gutter line so the new bituminous layer will match with the level of the concrete gutter. A 2-inch-thick layer of bituminous will be laid over the entire width of the street. The project would also involve replacing sections of curb & gutter that have settled and are causing drainage issues.

Work on SE Marshall Street from Prospect Avenue to I-35 will involve bituminous reclamation. This process grinds up the existing asphalt surface in place and mixes it with a portion of the underlying in-place gravel base. This will form a new aggregate road-base for the new bituminous pavement. One centerline culvert will also be replaced.

There are 69 properties to be assessed as part of this project (39 along Lake Chapeau Dr, 20 in the Crossroads Blvd area, and 10 along SE Marshall St). The assessments for the commercial properties in overlay areas depend on the width of the roadway and range between \$34.45 per foot to \$37.09 per foot. The preliminary assessment rate for SE Marshall Street is \$52.15 per foot. The preliminary assessment roll is attached to this report.

The assessment terms will be determined by following the City's Assessment Policy. The interest rate will be based on bonding in 2025.

The estimated project cost is \$1,098,887.39 and would be paid for with assessments, sanitary sewer funds, and City bonding funds.

E. Resolution Accepting Feasibility Report and Calling a Public Hearing at 7:00 PM, February 24, 2025 for the 2025 State Aid Street Overlay Project (Job 2502) –This item would accept a feasibility report and call a public improvement hearing for February 24, 2025 for the 2025 State Aid Street Overlay Project, City Job No. 2502.

This proposed project involves the bituminous mill & overlay and miscellaneous curb & gutter replacement on Garfield Avenue from Fairlane Terrace to Richway Drive.

Work in the mill & overlay area will involve milling the existing bituminous street surfacing for a 6-foot width along each concrete gutter line so the new bituminous layer will match with the level of the concrete gutter. A 2-inch-thick layer of

bituminous will be laid over the entire width of the street. The project would also involve replacing sections of curb & gutter that have settled and are causing drainage issues.

This section of Garfield Avenue was evaluated for Complete Streets improvements such as sidewalks, bike lanes, shared user paths, etc. Numerous constraints including narrow right-of-way and street widths, mature boulevard trees, and steep yard slopes make these improvements unfeasible without narrowing the road and eliminating on-street parking. Complete Streets improvements are not being proposed with this project.

There are 26 properties to be assessed as part of this project. The preliminary assessment rate is \$33.63 per foot. The preliminary assessment roll is attached to this report.

The assessment terms will be determined by following the City's Assessment Policy. The interest rate will be based on bonding in 2025.

The estimated project cost is \$200,902.08 and would be paid for with assessments, sanitary sewer funds, and City bonding funds. Staff recommends approval.

F. Resolution Accepting Feasibility Report and Calling a Public Hearing at 7:00 PM, February 24, 2025 for the 11th Street Reconstruction Project (Job 2503) – This item would accept a feasibility report and call a public improvement hearing for February 24, 2025 for the 11th Street Reconstruction Project, City Job No. 2503.

The proposed project calls for the complete reconstruction of the east end of 11<sup>th</sup> Street (approximately 355 total feet). Proposed work will include complete removal and replacement of the pavement, curb & gutter, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, and watermain. The street description is:

11<sup>th</sup> Street – Margaretha Avenue to the east end

11<sup>th</sup> Street is 31 feet wide from back-to-back of curb and is proposed to be reconstructed to the same configuration. The watermain has experienced a large and

increasing frequency of breaks. The other underground utilities have reached the end of their design life and are proposed for replacement with this project.

Assessments will be levied to the benefiting properties based upon replacing the pavement and curb & gutter. The proposed assessment rate is \$165.79 per foot.

Three commercial properties and one City-owned property are proposed to be assessed with this project. Following the assessment policy, the assessments will be over 15 years. The interest rate will be based on bonding in 2025.

The estimated project cost is \$531,316.24 and would be paid for with assessments, sanitary sewer funds, water funds, and City bonding funds. Staff recommends approval.

#### VIII. NEW BUSINESS

A. Resolution Entering a Professional Engineering Services Agreement with HDR Inc.Front Street Basin Project (Job 2507) — The City has received an \$885,724.21
Stormwater Resiliency Grant for design and construction of a stormwater raingarden type basin, including access and public use trails on City owned property located at 1300 Front Street. The estimated total cost of the project is \$1,027,789. The location of the drainage area is prone to flooding and consists of City owned parcels that are to be repurposed as stormwater detention basins. These parcels were donated to the city for the purpose of creating stormwater storage. Staff is recommending hiring HR Green based on a proposed fee not to exceed \$129,700.00 for professional engineering services to develop construction plans and cost estimate for the Front Street Basin design, perform wetland delineation, stormwater modeling with additional Geotech coordination, and ADA walkway and access improvements. Staff also recommends including approval of the option for an additional sum not to exceed \$44,000.00 for optional construction oversight. Total cost not to exceed \$173,700.00. Staff recommends approval.

B. Resolution Accepting Donations to the City Arena as Presented - Plans for remodeling the City Arena included building a small changing room for referees and hockey players in an unused corner of the skate-changing area outside the Nystrom Rink. Recreation staff members planned to build this room themselves, but Attig Construction offered its services as a donation. Geneva Lumber, Rink Systems and Albert Lea Electric have also offered supplies and services for the project at no charge. The in-kind donations total nearly \$6,500. In recognition of the donations, the 9.5 X 17-feet room will display the names of the donors, similar to a dasher board ad and similar to recognition at the City Arena for other donors. Staff recommends approval.

A. Public Hearing Regarding Disposal of Property – 1116 James Avenue

This public hearing is to determine if the property at 1116 James Avenue continues to have a public use. The only continued public use is a narrower easement to access a stormwater sewer line. Ownership by the City is not necessary.

Mayor Murray opened the public hearing. He called three times. No one spoke. Mayor Murray closed the public hearing.

### C. Resolution 25-008 Approving the Sale of City Owned Real Estate at 1211 Newton Avenue S.

Three parcels the City owns do not meet zoning requirements as does the neighboring property. In an agreement to finish remodeling the property at 1213 Newton Ave, the City agreed to split a portion of the property at 1211 Newton Ave and adjoin to 1213 Newton. With adjustments to the remaining property into two new parcels, the City will have lots that can be better developed without being oversized to the neighborhood. The property owner at 1213 will have a residential lot near zoning compliance. Staff recommends disposing the property by splitting it and adjoining to the neighboring property at 1213 Newton Ave.

## D. Resolution 25-009 Authorizing Broadway Ridge Grant with Susanne M. Crane at 224 S. Broadway

Susanne Crane submitted a Broadway Ridge Grant for reimbursement up to 50% of costs associated with roof replacement at 224 S Broadway. The total improvement cost is \$32,300 which will provide a matching grant of \$16,150. All improvements have been completed and reviewed by the City's Zoning and Building Official for compliance with application requirements.

The project is conditional that any and all other code violations be completed on or before June 30, 2025.

#### E. Resolution 25-010 Designating Two "Loading Zone" Stalls on Bridge Avenue (Job 2213)

Construction and installation of dock and kayak landing along Bridge Avenue is completed with the exception of the dock.

As part of the Cooperative Agreement between the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and the City, a loading/unloading zone is to be designated along Bridge Avenue adjacent to the landing entrance. This will ensure a kayak can be dropped off or picked up at this location. This resolution would authorize City staff to install signage designating this approximately 50-foot-long area. This would allow for short term parking for loading and unloading along this section of Bridge Avenue to provide safe, convenient access to the boat dock.

## F. Resolution 25-011 Approving Agreement for Professional Engineering Services - Snyder Field Bathrooms and Concession (Job 2317)

In 2020 the city had a facilities study performed of the J.M. Snyder field. Through this study it was determined that the facility needed improvements to drainage, restrooms, concession areas, parking, walkways, spectator areas, coaching areas, and general park spaces. It was also noted that ADA improvements were needed.

In 2022 drainage improvements were completed and in 2023 fence and dugouts were improved.

The city requested proposals public facilities design. The work involves seeking public input and facility demands to design concession, bathroom, picnic area, playground area, and ADA walkway and parking improvements. A cost estimate for the project was also a requirement of the proposal. All three consulting firms responded with proposals outlining professional planning and design services, as well as a cost estimate. Staff is recommending ISG of St Louis Park Minnesota for this work. The proposal stated a not to exceed fee of \$29,500.

The scope of work in their proposal accurately describes the deliverables sought by the city. The City has budgeted \$185,000 in fund 411 to cover this cost. This is PAR-26-04. A presentation to the Parks Advisory Board on the designs and costs are expected in late spring where they will receive input and direction from City Staff and the Parks Advisory Board. A final report is expected in April. The intent is to have a plan and costs by the summer of 2025 to allow for fundraising with construction scheduled for 2026.

The other two proposals were submitted by Bolton and Menk, Inc. and WSB Inc. The proposals submitted by each firm were impressive and each should be considered for future work.

Resolution 25-013 Accepting the Offer of the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority to Purchase a \$1,030,781 Taxable Grant Anticipation Revenue Note of 2025A Providing for its Issuance and Authorizing Execution of a Minnesota Public Facilities Authority Master Loan (Bond Purchase) and/or Grant Agreement and a Lead Service Line Replacement Program Project Order ID Albert Lea LSLR 01 MDH Project ID 124001-4

The 2023 Minnesota Legislature appropriated \$240 million for lead service line replacements and approximately \$40 million per year in federal funds from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act is also available. To access these funds, public water systems apply through the Drinking Water Revolving Fund, which is jointly administered by the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) and the Public Facilities Authority (PFA).

In 2023 the City of Albert Lea applied for and received loan and grant funding to replace approximately 150 private and public lead water services. As part of this the City is to issue a \$1,030,781 Taxable Grant Anticipation Revenue Note. This note issuance will be February 5th. The PFA will repay the full amount of the note through a grant and Master Agreement.

I. Resolution 25-014 Authorizing FY2029 Blake Avenue (East Main Street to Marshall Street) Grant Application

This resolution authorizes staff to apply for Federal Surface Transportation Funds for fiscal year 2029 via the Minnesota Department of Transportation. The proposed project is a resurfacing project of Blake Avenue from E. Main Street to TH-65. Proposed work includes bituminous mill & overlay, and installation of new sidewalk.

The city has been awarded Federal funding for the resurfacing of Blake Avenue from E. Main Street to TH-65 in fiscal year 2028. If awarded, the entire length of the Blake Avenue resurfacing project would be funded. If awarded, this funding would be advanced so that the entire project can take place in 2028.

#### J. Resolution 25-015 Approving Preliminary and Final Plat of Blazing Star No. 2

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on December 3, 2024 to review Preliminary and Final Plat of Blazing Star No. 2 for compliance with Chapter 38 Subdivisions. The layout of the lots and blocks were largely based on areas of contamination and consequent required cleanup as well as grade of the overall property.

The 2040 Comprehensive plan identifies the Blazing Star site as a key development area due to the close proximity to both lakes and the walkability aspects from the property to the downtown and any number of retail or natural amenities. Planning Commission recommends approval.

- Both outlot A and B are plated as outlots due to the floodplain and the likelihood of those areas remaining parks and/or open space.
- The railroad crossing is being platted as outlot D until such time the railroad is willing to sign the Right-Of-Way or crossing access.

Rigg displayed a certificate of survey outlining the adjustments to these property lines indicating the division of the property between two residents.

C. Resolution Approving the Sale of City Owned Real Estate at 1211 Newton Avenue S.

Rigg displayed a map defining the adjustments to the parcels.

D. Resolution Authorizing Broadway Ridge Grant with Susanne M. Crane at 224 S. Broadway

City Attorney Holstad explained a mortgage is being added to this grant as a condition to ensure any and all code violations will be completed on or before June 30, 2025. This includes replacement of the second-floor windows to historic preservation standards. Once the code violations are corrected, the loan will be satisfied.

E. Resolution Designating Two "Loading Zone" Stalls on Bridge Avenue (Job 2213)

Rigg explained this loading zone is required as part of the grant agreement with MNDOT related to the partnership of installing a boat dock/kayak landing. He emphasized this loading zone is for unloading kayaks and is not meant for unloading motor boats. Jahnke said two "loading zone only" signs will also be added.

F. Resolution Approving Agreement for Professional Engineering Services - Snyder Field Bathrooms and Concession (Job 2317)

Jahnke said although there are illustrations of the proposed concessions and bathrooms and cost estimates have been provided, there is not an actual design nor affirmative cost. In response to councilor Christensen's comment regarding the fee for professional engineering services, Jahnke responded the other two bids received were considerably higher.

Baker asked for an update of where the City is at with the contract with Riverland for the use of Snyder Field. Rigg responded that once the improvements are complete and a dollar amount is available, a new contract will be negotiated.

G. Resolution Supporting Active Transportation Application - New Paved Trail from Albert Lea to Manchester (Job 2411)

Rigg deferred to Jahnke for additional comment on this item. Jahnke said this is one of several applications submitted for funding that would be used for the trail and/or bridge repairs; depending on the amount of funding ultimately received. This particular application is for a million dollars to be used for construction of the trail that would run from Fountain Street to Manchester. In response to councilor Anderson, Jahnke clarified that the County is the sponsor on this application process with the City of Albert Lea, Manchester, and MNDOT to also provide a letter of support for the construction and maintenance of the proposed trail.

H. Councilor Christensen asked for confirmation that this is a forgivable non-interest loan, to which Rigg confirmed it is. Jahnke interjected explaining the process includes the city receiving the loan and as the work is completed, the city submits for reimbursement.

Jahnke said in addition to resurfacing and adding curb and gutter, this project will include filling in the ditch on the East side of Main Street and installing a storm sewer to allow for the installation of a sidewalk. #### Neighborhood Improvement Overlay and Curb & Gutter Replacement

This portion of the project involves the bituminous overlay of streets in the southeast area of town as well as the west end of Lake Chapeau Drive. The streets are as follows:

Crossroads Boulevard – TH-65 to the south end Betha Larson Lane – Crossroads Boulevard to the east end Ross Drive – Crossroads Boulevard to Betha Larson Lane Kram Avenue – Betha Larson Lane to the north end Lake Chapeau Drive – City Arena to the west end

The project will involve milling the existing bituminous street surfacing for a 6-foot width along each concrete gutter line so the new bituminous layer will match with the level of the concrete gutter. A 2-inch thick layer of bituminous will be laid over the entire width of the street. The project would also involve replacing sections of curb & gutter that have settled and are causing drainage issues.

The City costs are for side yard credits, work in the intersections, and for work along City-owned property. The sanitary sewer costs are for repairs to manholes that will be completed as part of this project and done prior to placement of the overlay.

The average age of these streets is 29 years old. The streets proposed for mill & overlay were constructed in 2001 or 2002 and have not been overlaid. A summary of these streets and ages is attached. Typically, Engineering has tried to extend the life of the roadways by performing an overlay between year 20 and 30 and every 15 to 25 years thereafter. The goal is to extend the life of the roadway to approximately a 75 year life. This is the estimated life of the underground utilities.

The total centerline footage of the project is approximately 11,541 linear feet (2.19 miles). Other recent Neighborhood Improvement Project overlay areas had total centerline footages of 11,121 ft in 2024; 11,561 ft in 2021, 15,363 ft in 2020; and 14,914 ft in 2018.

#### Bituminous Surface Reconstruction - SE Marshall Street - Prospect Avenue to I-35

The bituminous pavement on SE Marshall Street from Prospect Avenue to the I-35 bridge is deteriorated past the point where an overlay will be beneficial. Engineering is proposing to utilize a process of reclamation with this project. This process grinds up the existing asphalt surface in place and mixes it with a portion of the underlying inplace gravel base. This will form a new aggregate roadbase for the new bituminous pavement.

One centerline culvert underneath SE Marshall Street is proposed to be replaced as part of this project.

The properties abutting this street are a mix of residential lots, agriculture land and commercially zoned properties. Per the Assessment Policy, the assessed footage for the residential lot is capped at 150 feet while the footage for commercial agriculture properties is not capped.

SE Marshall Street was paved in 1957 and overlaid in 1986.

#### Miscellaneous Concrete Work

Also proposed with this project is to complete a few minor concrete repairs and improvements throughout the City. These improvements are:

- Replacement of deteriorated sidewalk on the south side of Clark Street between Elizabeth Avenue and Bridge Avenue
- Install valley gutter across the intersection of Bayview Drive with Greenwood Drive. This is to correct a drainage issue
  that was caused by the curb replacement on Greenwood Drive in 2024.
- Fountain Street/Summer Avenue pedestrian ramp: The existing pedestrian crossing at Fountain Street and Summer Avenue is a marked crosswalk to provide safe crossing and access to Lakeview School. There currently is no pedestrian ramp on the south side of Fountain Street. Proposed with this project is to upgrade this to an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant pedestrian ramp

#### Complete Streets Review

All streets in the project area were evaluated for complete streets improvements such as additional sidewalk, bike lanes, shared user paths, etc.

Lake Chapeau Dr is a low speed, low volume residential road and adequately and safely accommodates both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Engineering does not feel this neighborhood would benefit from the addition of sidewalk and are not proposing any complete streets improvements for these streets.

The Crossroads Boulevard area is almost completely commercial or industrial in nature and does not connect to any existing pedestrian facilities. The addition of sidewalk would not be expected to generate significant pedestrian traffic and is not being proposed with this project.

Installing a sidewalk or shared user trail along SE Marshall Street would require significant grading of the ditch areas and would be cost-prohibitive. These facilities would also not be expected to generate notable pedestrian activity and would likely be underutilized. No complete streets improvements are proposed for SE Marshall Street.

#### **Assessments**

There are 69 properties to be assessed as part of this project (39 along Lake Chapeau Dr, 20 in the Crossroads Blvd area, and 10 along SE Marshall St). The assessments for the commercial properties in overlay areas depend on the width of the roadway and range between \$34.45 per foot to \$37.09 per foot. The preliminary assessment rate for SE Marshall Street is \$52.15 per foot.

The assessment breakdown is as follows:

The assessment term will be determined using the City's Assessment Policy. The interest rate will be based on bonding in 2025.

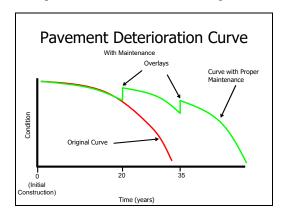
#### **Pavement Management Program**

The Engineering Department has put together a Pavement Management Program in order to better target which streets are due for routine maintenance, overlays, or complete replacement. The goal of this program is to delay progressive failures and reduce the need for service activities and routine maintenance by implementing a schedule of preventative maintenance. Put simply, a preventative maintenance program seeks to "do the right treatment at the right time." In the past, a corrective maintenance plan was used where street failures were fixed as they arose. Since activities associated with corrective maintenance are generally considered more extensive, preventative maintenance plans have been shown to be much more cost-effective.

There are a number of treatments that will be used with this program. They are as follows:

- 1. Do nothing: If a street is already in very poor condition, the best solution may be to put off any action for a number of years until a complete reconstruction is warranted.
- 2. Patch: Lasts 1 year; adds no structural capacity.
- 3. Crack Seal: Used to stop a crack from spreading and for preventing water from seeping into the crack.
- 4. Chip Seal: Lasts 5 years; adds no structural capacity.
- 5. Overlay: Lasts 10+ years; increases structural capacity.
- 6. Reconstruct: The design life for the City's water and sewer lines is 75 years. As such, when a street reconstruction is warranted, the City will attempt to coincide it with this 75 year mark for the sewer and water.

The following figure shows how the life of a pavement can be extended through the use of preventive maintenance.



The following table shows the schedule recommended by Mn/DOT for low volume bituminous roads.

The average age of these streets to be overlaid is 29 years old, and have not been overlaid. Many of these streets are showing signs of aging and are at the point where an overlay will benefit them the most. If the City were to put off maintenance on these streets for much longer, the cracks that are there now will have grown, and new cracks will have formed. These new and larger cracks would reflect through the overlay much sooner than if the overlay were installed as proposed in this report.

#### Proposed Mill & Overlay Work

This proposed project involves the bituminous overlay of Garfield Avenue from Fairlane Terrace to Richway Drive. Proposed work includes

- Replacement of settled or damaged curb & gutter
- Mill bituminous 2" deep along the edges
- Place a new 2" bituminous overlay over the entire surface

The City costs are for side yard credits, lots with more than 150 ft of front footage, work in the intersections, and for work along City-owned property.

Typically Engineering has tried to extend the life of the roadways by performing an overlay between year 20 and 30 and every 15 to 25 years thereafter. The goal is to extend the life of the roadway to approximately a 75 year life. This is the estimated life of the underground utilities. The section proposed for an overlay was last overlaid in 2001.

The total centerline footage of the project is approximately 1,419 linear feet (0.27 miles). Other recent State Aid Street overlay areas had total centerline footages of 3,011 ft in 2024; 4,816 ft in 2023, 9,390 ft in 2021; and 9,303 ft in 2018.

#### **Complete Streets Review**

Since 2006, the City has actively worked to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety, including closing sidewalk gaps and implementing a Complete Streets policy in 2009. This policy requires consideration of all transportation modes in street projects.

The City's Assessment Policy now prioritizes sidewalks on at least one side of all feasible state aid streets. However, an evaluation of this section of Garfield Avenue revealed significant challenges to incorporating complete street improvements.

The narrow right-of-way (approximately 13 feet), limited street width, mature boulevard trees, and steep yard slopes make adding a sidewalk without narrowing the road impossible.

On-street parking is currently restricted to the east side to meet state road width requirements. Narrowing the road to accommodate a sidewalk would eliminate on-street parking on both sides. Therefore, complete streets improvements are not being proposed with this project.

#### **Assessments**

There are 26 properties to be assessed as part of this project. The preliminary assessment rate for the curb & gutter and mill & overlay is \$33.63 per front foot. The assessment breakdown is as follows:

Average Assessment:	\$3,002.68
Median Assessment:	\$2,855.61
Lowest Assessment:	\$2,354.10
Highest Assessment:	\$4,492.97

The assessment term will be determined using the City's Assessment Policy. The interest rate will be based on bonding in 2025.

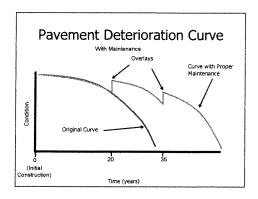
#### **Pavement Management Program**

The Engineering Department has put together a Pavement Management Program in order to better target which streets are due for routine maintenance, overlays, or complete replacement. The goal of this program is to delay progressive failures and reduce the need for service activities and routine maintenance by implementing a schedule of preventative maintenance. Put simply, a preventative maintenance program seeks to "do the right treatment at the right time." In the past, a corrective maintenance plan was used where street failures were fixed as they arose. Since activities associated with corrective maintenance are generally considered more extensive, preventative maintenance plans have been shown to be much more cost-effective.

There are a number of treatments that will be used with this program. They are as follows:

- 1. Do nothing: If a street is already in very poor condition, the best solution may be to put off any action for a number of years until a complete reconstruction is warranted.
- 2. Patch: Lasts 1 year; adds no structural capacity.
- 3. Crack Seal: Used to stop a crack from spreading and for preventing water from seeping into the crack.
- 4. Chip Seal: Lasts 5 years; adds no structural capacity.
- 5. Overlay: Lasts 10+ years; increases structural capacity.
- 6. Reconstruct: The design life for the City's water and sewer lines is 75 years. As such, when a street reconstruction is warranted, the City will attempt to coincide it with this 75 year mark for the sewer and water.

The following figure shows how the life of a pavement can be extended through the use of preventive maintenance.



The following table shows the schedule recommended by Mn/DOT for low volume bituminous roads.

These streets are showing signs of aging and are at the point where an overlay will benefit them the most. If the City were to put off maintenance on these streets for much longer, the cracks that are there now will have grown, and new cracks will have formed. These new and larger cracks would reflect through the overlay much sooner than if the overlay were installed as proposed in this report.

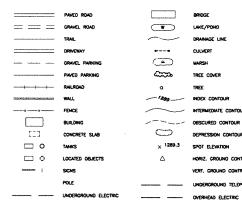

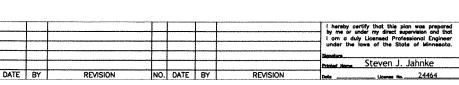

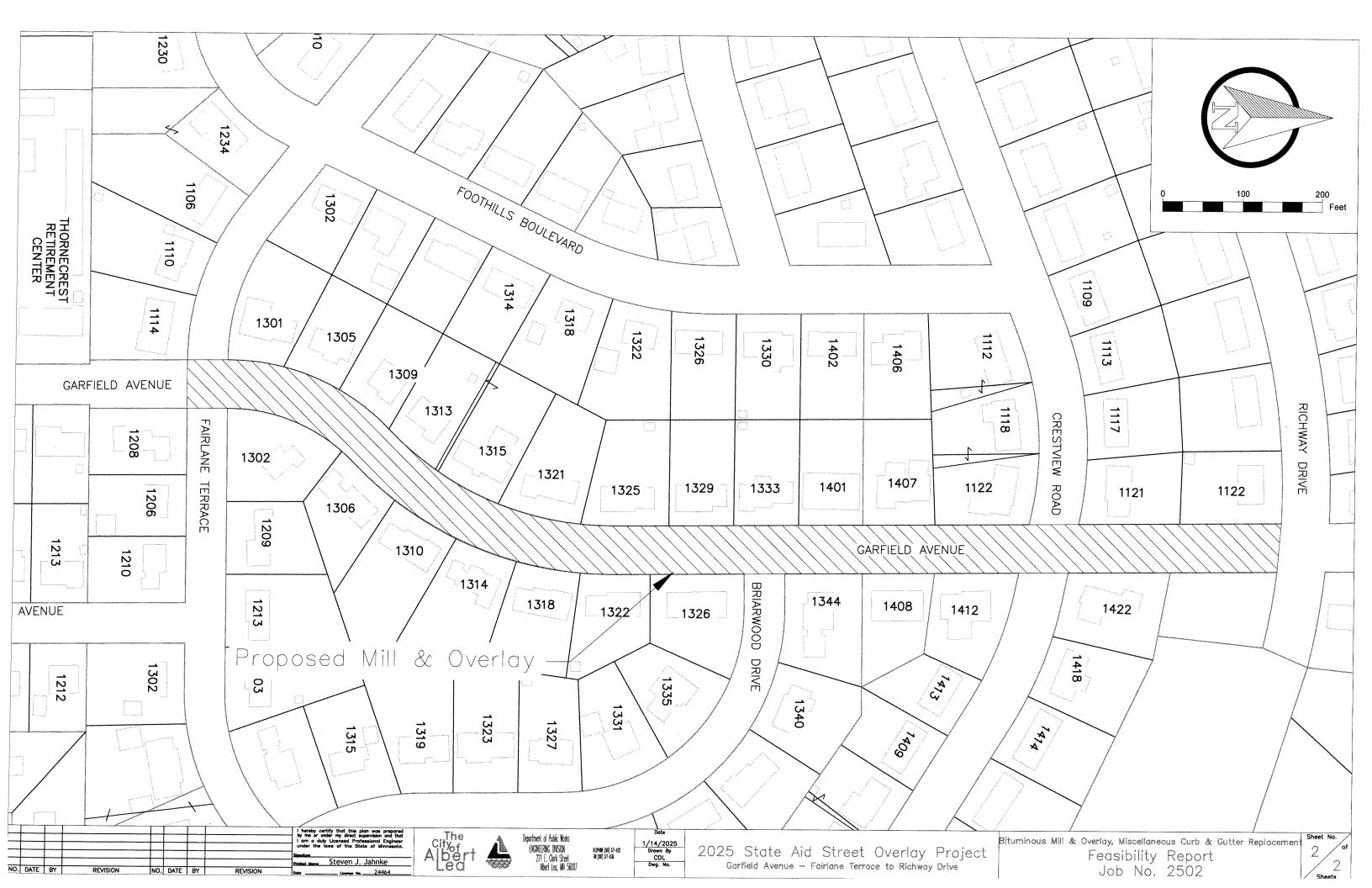

#### SUMMARY OF IMPROVEMENTS

The proposed project calls for the complete reconstruction of portions of the east end of 11<sup>th</sup> Street (approximately 355 total feet). Proposed work will include complete removal and replacement of the pavement, curb & gutter, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, and watermain. The street description is:

• 11th Street - Margaretha Avenue to the east end

11<sup>th</sup> Street is 31 feet wide from back-to-back of curb with no sidewalk and is proposed to be reconstructed to the same configuration.

#### Complete Street Review

This project was evaluated for complete streets improvements such as additional sidewalk, bike lanes, shared user paths, etc.

There is no sidewalk along 11<sup>th</sup> Street, however there is sidewalk on Margaretha Avenue serving this area. 11<sup>th</sup> Street is a low-volume, low speed roadway that adequately and safely accommodates both vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

Engineering does not feel this street would benefit from the addition of sidewalk and is not proposing any complete streets improvements with this project.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The existing pavement was constructed in 1965. The watermain, sanitary sewer and storm sewer were constructed between 1952 and 1967. The watermain has experienced a large and increasing number of watermain breaks. The other utilities have reached the end of their useful life. If left in place, these utilities would not last as long as the new roadway and are recommended to be replaced.

The curb & gutter will also be replaced to allow for the reconstruction of the underground utilities.

The City of Albert Lea has had this project on its Capital Improvement Plan for several years. The Albert Lea City Council authorized the preparation of a feasibility study for this project.

Assessments will be levied to the benefiting properties based upon the costs for removing and replacing the pavement and curb & gutter. The proposed preliminary assessment rate is \$165.79 per foot.

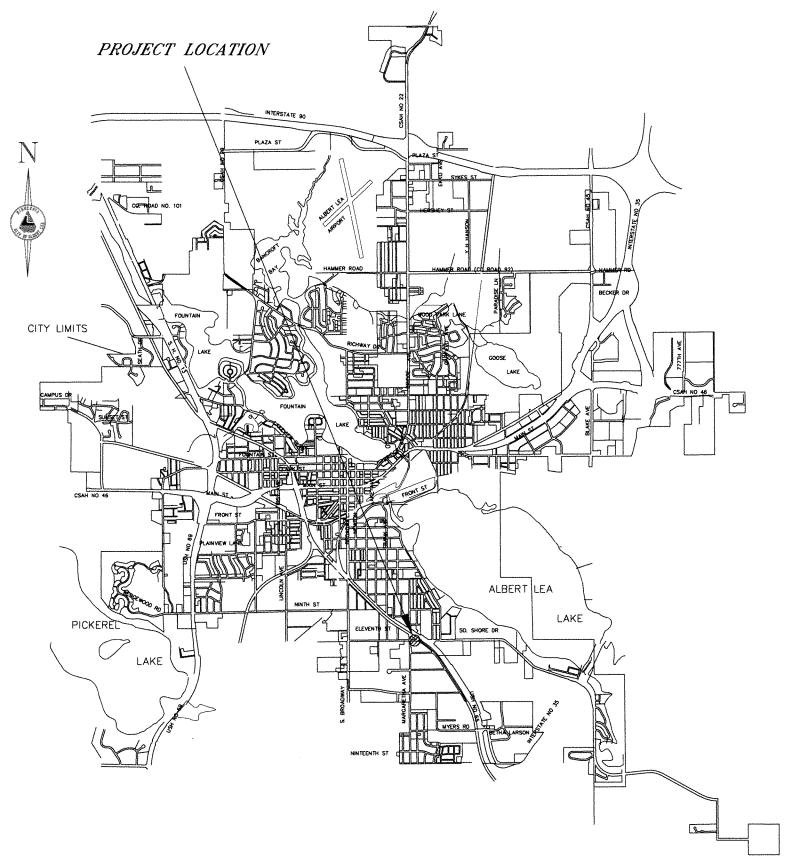

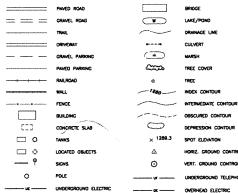

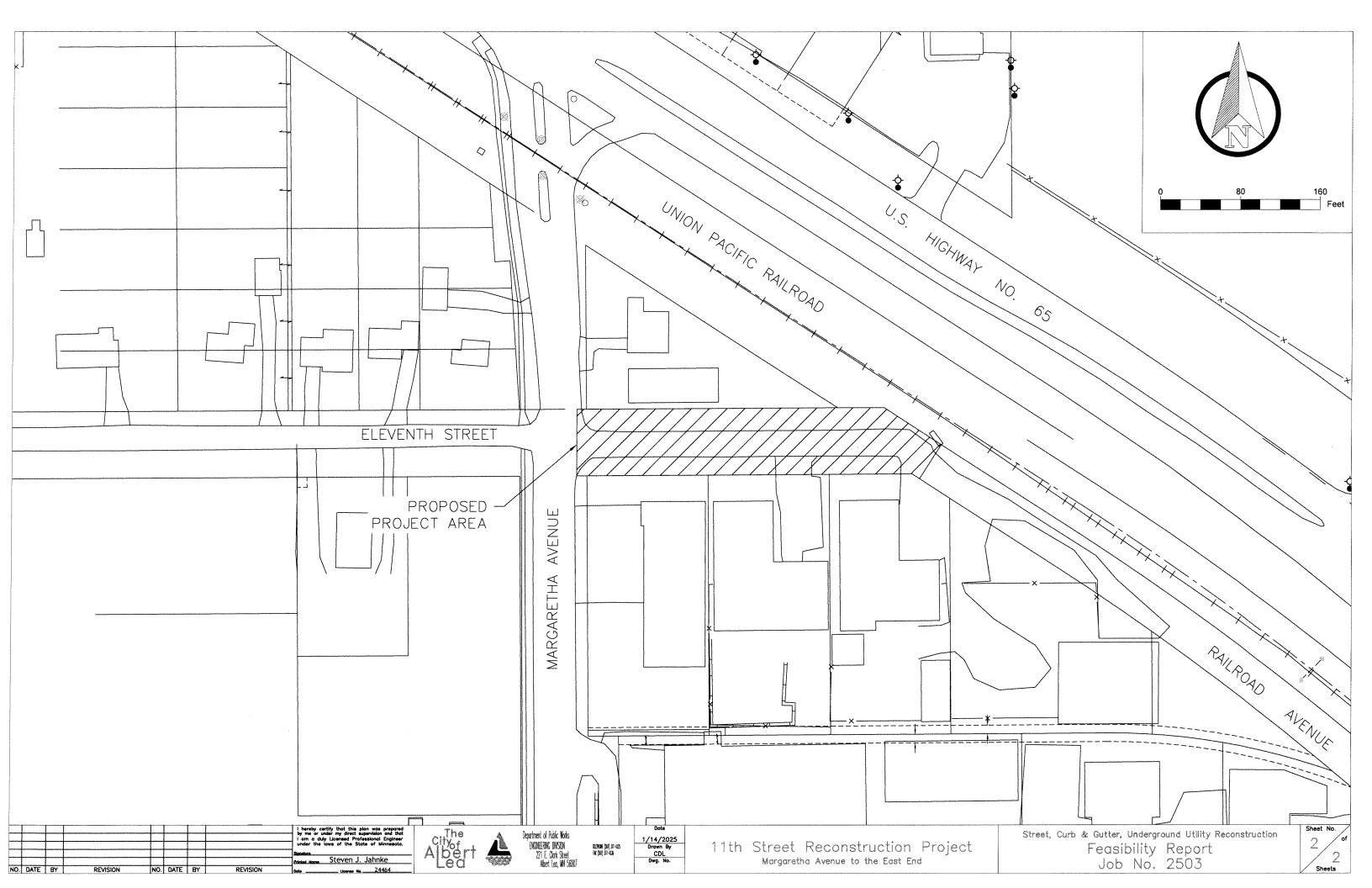
