Recreation: Report provided by Bob Furland and Dani Bakken;

- Docks and Gardens Afton has been extremely busy renting docks and gardens again this year. The City rents 101 gardens and 275 dock spaces. This is an enormous task over a five-week period. We will open up at 6:00 AM on Friday April 14th for the public to rent open dock spaces.
- The City, CVB, and Main Street is sponsoring a pride event June 17th Noon to 4 pm in central park. Albert Lea is holding these events as part of its on-going efforts to celebrate our community's growing diversity.
- Diversity & Inclusion Training Workshop Save the Date: May 3rd more details soon.
- Recreation Summer Fun Guide catalog is getting final touches and will be sent out shortly. Registration for the activities in the fun guide will start on May 1.
- Programs:
 - We held the Easter bunny deliveries on Friday April 7. We had 2 sessions and had a total of 49 kids participate. We heard a lot of positive feedback from the families that did participate
 - Easter Egg Hunt was help on April 8 at Central park we had about 260 kids participate and everyone had fun!

- The City of Albert Lea has contracted with Apex to complete a comprehensive building and energy audit for the City Arena and Albert Lea Aquatic center.
 - Apex is the same company that the county has hired. Apex will perform comprehensive assessments of your facilities. The purpose of the assessments is to provide tools to make accurate decisions involving your facilities. The assessment will provide the City with conditions, useful lives, options and recommendations for the assets in those facilities. This will set up the City to plan for optimal learning environments in the most cost-effective manner. They will look at energy savings of building and mechanical improvements and paybacks for making the improvements. April 25th will be the kick off for this study.
- Albert Lea Figure Skating show was held March 25th and 26th. The show went very well and featured alumni skaters.
- Ice was taken out on the Nystrom arena March 27-30th
- Minnesota Mavericks AAA hockey group had 5 teams practicing at the City arena on March 31, April 1 and 2. Players from Iowa and Minnesota participated.
