What a successful year!

On behalf of the City of Albert Lea, I would like to thank the Parks and Rec Board for a successful and productive year. You all did an incredible job on narrowing down the projects for our rec facilities and then supporting the referendum that passed 3:1 in favor.

The Board vetted and recommended the following projects, which are headed for implementation:

- Improvements to Grizzlies Field
- Bicycle shelter at Frank Hall Park
- Storage shed for softball at Snyder Fields

The Board has also helped 4 of its top 5 priorities move forward:

- Restrooms by the Splash Pad under design
- Develop trail along former UP rail funding is in place for planning it
- Upgrade Snyder Fields some improvements made with more in the works
- Update aging facilities new systems are in the works for the Arena, Aquatic Center and Marion Ross Theater with remodeling at the Arena and Aquatic Center about to open for bids

That leaves the off-season field house to move forward if the Board chooses that as a priority in 2025.

And even Pickleball has now submitted a full application for new courts!

Updates on City Council action

The Albert Lea City Council unanimously approved the plans and specs Dec. 9 for the remodeling at the City Arena and Aquatic Center, and ordered bids for the project.

The public notice for bids will be published in the Albert Lea Tribune on Dec. 21, 2024. Bids will close at 2 p.m. on Jan. 16, 2025, when Apex – now called "InBylt" – will hold bid opening online via Procore. If the low bid is within budget, then I plan to take it to the Council for approval at the Jan. 27, 2025 meeting.

In other action, the Council:

- Approved the city's budget, property tax levy, capital improvement plan and fees for 2025.
 The property tax levy will increase 14% from 2024 to 2025, with nearly 10% of that increase for referendum projects. The impact to property owners is about \$60 per year per \$100,000 in home value.
- The CIP includes several Parks and Rec projects:
 - o Improvements to Grizzlies Field as recommended by the Parks and Rec Board
 - New playground equipment at Ginkel and Lakeview parks
 - New shelter at Morin Park
 - Storm shelter at Sondegaard Park for nearby mobile home parks
 - o 2 new Rec Department vehicles
 - New referee changing area in the hallway outside the Nystrom Rink (previously an Apex project and now a Rec Department project)
 - Funding for planning the new trail along the former UP rail corridor from Fountain
 Street to Manchester

Update on Senior Center

The City of Albert Lea and Albert Lea Family Y are renewing their contract for the Y operating the Senior Center for an additional 2 years. This contract will end on Dec. 31, 2026, when the lease with Skyline Plaza for the Senior Center space also expires.

The City and Y are starting an evaluation of the Senior Center, including alternative locations, in January. We are putting together a team of community representatives to meet the first Wednesday of each month at 10:30 a.m. at the Senior Center, except the first meeting will be Jan. 8. We expect the process to take 6-7 months. If any Board members are interested in serving on the team, please let Cathy know.
