- Learn to Skate had their last class of the current session on Sunday, February 9
 - Plans for next season will be made once we know more specifically on when fall ice will be in.
- Outdoor ice rinks and warming houses are still going strong despite temporary breaks due to warm temperatures and now too cold temperatures.
- Special Olympics Young Athletes program will have their last class on February 25. It had 18
 participants and was held at United Pre-School on Tuesday evenings. Two Special Olympics
 Young Athlete instructors, volunteers from the National Honor Society, and other high schoolage students operated the program.
- Winter Candle Light Walk scheduled at Myre-Big Island State Park Feb 15 was cancelled due to the potential of strong wind and wind chill temperatures.

- Facility updates
 - A low-E ceiling has been installed in the Colstrup rink. The Low-Emissivity Ceiling is suspended over the ice surface, acting as a radiant barrier between a warm roof and the ice below it, reducing energy costs to cool the ice.
 - LED Arena Lighting has been installed over both ice rinks. The lights will save energy and improve visibility. The contractor also installs and upgrades LED lights in the building's rooms.
 - The Council unanimously voted to accept a \$250,000 donation from the Albert Lea Hockey Association for the lobby expansion at the City Arena.
 - The Council also unanimously approved the low bid for remodeling the City Arena and Aquatic Center and a construction management agreement with Apex Facility Solutions.
