# Presentation of Apex proposal for Recreational Facilities and Solar Systems

Cathy Malakowsky discussed the why and purpose for the proposal prior to introducing the Apex team. Purpose:

Ensure long term viability Decrease energy use Enhance safety of users Meet building codes

Goal of presentation:

Apex is an energy services company that helps leverage energy savings through new equipment. Apex staff presented on the current conditions of the facilities (City Arena, Aquatic Center, Marion Ross Theater) specifically the aging equipment, energy efficiency, and infrastructure limitations with the goal of avoiding catastrophic failure. The Apex team also discussed the potential incentives for this project.

Presentation feedback from user groups:

Kelly Peterson (Figure skating) – felt the structural beam repair was a priority as well as getting the practice ice (Colstrup Arena) repaired.

Todd Ulve (Youth Hockey Association) – would like to see the summer ice issue resolved as both youth and high school hockey would like to stay local for summer ice usage and right now we are barely able to make it to late June on Colstrup. Todd would also like to see the development of a dryland area. There was also discussion on an outdoor rink option at the City Arena in the future.

Ty Prater (Waldorf University) – also expressed interest in the summer ice option as for Waldorf. Abbey Schumacher (Youth Hockey Association) – felt that the upgrades to the high school and youth locker rooms could come later and did not believe that there was a need to make the 2<sup>nd</sup> level ADA accessible by putting in an elevator.

Steve Ball (Park and Recreation Advisory Board Chair) – feels very strongly that we don't want to just catch up and that we need to do what we can to get to get beyond where we need to be with our facilities.

# Staff Reports:

Recreation: Report provided by Bob Furland and Dani Bakken;

- Thursdays on Fountain have been well attended, with more than 500 people at most concerts.
- Albert Lea Pride was held on June 17<sup>.</sup> Hundreds of people attended the event. The event went very well, with food trucks and seven resources for attendees.
- Staff is Preparing the 2024 budget.
- Play parks
  - Play Parks have been going well and we have heard good feedback with the collaboration with Community Education

- The last day of ice was June 30. Ice has been removed, and compressors shut off.
- Rink Tech will be coming on July 11 to repair the small leaks in the Nystrom Arena floor.
- The Nystrom Arena had 3 dry floor event rentals for quinceaneras last month.

Aquatic Center: Report provided by Bob Furland/Dani Bakken;

- As of July 3<sup>rd</sup> we have had 8,486 people visit the aquatic center.
- Aquatic Center will close on August 13 for the season.
- We sold 180 passes this year.
- Swim lessons
  - Session 1 ended on June 23
  - Session 2 started July 10
    - 180 people are registered

- We are offering the Children's Center lessons once again this year at their own time so it does not take up spots for the general public
- Movie in the park
  - We cancelled movie in the park on July 7 due to the weather
  - We have rescheduled it for July 28
  - August movie in the park is being sponsored by Leland Reality and will be held on August 18
- Mermaid/pirate day
  - We held our first mermaid/pirate day at the aquatic center on July 8
  - Mermaid Analise came and she was a huge hit with the kids
  - We had about 40 people attend the event
- Upcoming Special events:
  - July 19- Pop up play park at Sondergaard
  - July 21- Third Lair at Skate park
  - July 25- holidays at the pool- Santa will be there from 1-3 and the grinch will be there from 6:30-8
  - July 26- Pop up play park at Valley
  - July 28- Movie in the park

• Inclusive Playground: I am sad and disappointed that the DNR has turned down the City's application again for \$300,000 in the funding for the Inclusive Playground. See their response below. City staff will meet with the All Together group soon to brainstorm on how to move forward.

Hi Cathy,

The main issue is that we do not have enough funding available to reach all the projects. This program is very competitive. Your application was well written and included all the requested information.

There were some concerns by the reviewers related to the roadway separating the play areas and pavilion facility. The parking lots together hold 100+ vehicles, suggesting a great amount of traffic on this road, even if a low-speed limit is posted. Also, some question that separation of two play areas may segregate children of differing abilities. Overall, some additional priority is given to redevelopment of facilities to address safety and/or access concerns.
