- New Pelican breeze dock is in, still has a little work to do adjusting the ramps.

- The **Council approved the first design contract with Apex** for the refrigeration system, frost removal and new Colstrup floor at the Arena.
- As part of approving changes to the fee schedule, the **Council also approved** the:
  - Scholarship program for Rec programs, in which families receiving any kind of assistance receive a 70% discount on the program fees. At this time, the scholarship applies only to swim lessons, Mites Hockey and Learn to Skate.
  - 1 flat reservation fee for food trucks.

- Changes to Mobile Vendor Reservations The City is exploring working with a local business on a start-up program that will make reservations and access possible through a 3<sup>rd</sup> party pay and locking system. This will be similar to bike or kayak rentals. The price needs to be changed from "electric only" to "reservation" regardless of electric use in order for the agreement to work. This will be explored for approximately 24 months.
- During the May 13 city council public forum, resident Joel Erickson and Councilor Larry Baker asked for signs on local trails advising "Slow biking, 10 mph limit" due to recent brushes with ebikes speeding on the trail.
- The council approved the second design contact with Apex for the remainder of the Rec Facility projects (except for a few at the theater and the downtown restrooms).
- The council voted yes for changing the Grizzlies field and allowing 2 shipping containers for longterm storage. They also thanked Ron Eriksmoen for providing a great program for students and attracting more visitors to Albert Lea.

Restrooms by Splash Pad -

• Parks staff are currently working on plans for the design of this project.

Develop the Union Pacific rail to trail -

• Trails Association recently learned that naming the new portion of the trail "Blazing Star" could risk receiving funding because of confusion over whether it's a state trail funded by the DNR or a regional trail funded by other sources. So, Cathy suggest the Parks and Rec Board's runner-up, "Southern Star". Ultimately the County Board will decide the name.

Develop an off-season field house -
